In 2022/23, the transformer station and the guard building of the former camp were renovated in accordance with monument protection and now serve as a memorial site. The permanent exhibition provides detailed information on the regional camps as well as the war cemeteries in Emsland and the County of Bentheim.

# Memorial site CAMP XII DALUM

A place of remembrance and commemoration of the victims of the National Socialist Emsland camps in Dalum, Groß Hesepe, Fullen, Versen, Wesuwe, Oberlangen, Wietmarschen, Alexisdorf and Bathorn

## THE EMSLAND CAMPS

Between 1933 and 1945, the National Socialist State maintained 15 prison camps in Emsland and the County of Bentheim.

As part of the judiciary system and the system of SS and Wehrmacht, all camps were places of terror. In total, up to 10,000 concentration camp prisoners and up to 70,000 convicts suffered in the Emsland camps. During the war, far more than 100,000 prisoners of war were added to that number.

The prisoners had to do heavy forced labour in cultivating the moors, in the peat and armaments industry, in agriculture and handicrafts, and other work crews.

More than 20,000 people, most of them Soviet POWs, starved to death, died of exhaustion and disease because of physical abuse, or were "shot on the run."

The construction of the Emsland camps took place in three phases, which overlapped in time:

## Phase I 1933-1934/36

Concentration camps (Börgermoor, Neusustrum, Esterwegen) under the responsibility of the State of Prussia (1933/34), from June 1934 to September 1936 the Esterwegen camp was under the direct command of Reichsführer-SS Heinrich Himmler.



## Phase II 1934-1945

**Prison camps** under the responsibility of the Reich Judiciary (I Börgermoor, II Aschendorfermoor, III Brual-Rhede, IV Walchum, V Neusustrum, VI Oberlangen, from 1937 also VII Esterwegen). The prison camps IX Versen, X Fullen and XIV Bathorn, which were set up in 1938/39, were only occupied by prisoners for a short time until the autumn of 1939.

### Phase III 1939-1945

POW camps of the High Command of the Wehrmacht (VI Oberlangen, VIII Wesuwe, IX Versen, X Fullen, XI Groß Hesepe, XII Dalum, XIII Wietmarschen, XIV Bathorn, XV Alexisdorf).
